Scholarships are available annually to support four levels of study:

1. Two x \$5,000 per annum for three years for University study in mining related subjects.
2. One x \$4,000 for one year of University study in any subject.
3. Five x \$1,000 each for study at Yukon College.
4. \$500 study assistance packages for Secondary School. (20 awarded in 2016)

Applicants must be Kaska who meet the specific academic criteria set out in one of the four scholarship categories. The program will accept applications until September 1<sup>st</sup> for the 2017 awards.
